Leadership Circle Luncheon Recognizing the generosity of our benefactors

The annual Lifeworks Leadership Circle Luncheon was held Thursday, February 7 in the Jackson Room of the Travelers Building in St. Paul. More than 100 Lifeworks supporters, clients, board members, and staff gathered to celebrate the organization and recognize the generosity of its benefactors, whose gifts totaled \$704,265 for the year 2007.

"You're our closest friends and our strongest donors," said Judy Lysne, president and CEO of Lifeworks, as she thanked the crowd after recognizing each donor individually.

Among those recognized were Eugene and Nancy Booker, who took advantage of an opportunity to withdraw money from an IRA and donate it to a charity. The Bookers' gift was used to support job development and transportation costs at Lifeworks — areas to which the Bookers are especially committed.

"Lifeworks found our daughter [Anne] a job that she loves," said Nancy, noting that Lifeworks also helps Anne with her

transportation needs. "Anne works five days a week at Lifetime Fitness and has her own cubicle. She feels so fulfilled, and that means a great deal to us as parents."

Eugene said that donating to Lifeworks was not just about honoring an organization that makes a difference in his daughter's life; it was also about supporting a well-run organization.

"Lifeworks has a great culture from the top down," he said.

That sentiment was echoed by Mike Freundschuh of Nonprofits' Insurance Agency.

"I work with 185 nonprofits, and there are only three I consider to be top tier," said Mike. "Lifeworks is one of the three, and that's in large due to the attitude of the employees. They are very caring people and they are committed to the organization. Their management stability is impressive. And Judy [Lysne] you cannot beat. She commands respect."

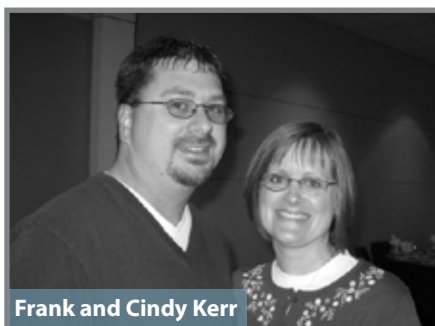

Each year Lifeworks conducts a survey of one of our customer groups with the generous support of Kenexa. In late 2007, we surveyed family members of the individuals we support in our Career Development, Social Enrichment, and Customized Support programs to find out what's working, what's not, and what we can do better.

We are excited by and proud of the overwhelmingly positive results with 93 percent of the families we surveyed reporting that they are satisfied or very satisfied with the quality of services and programs Lifeworks provides and 94 percent said they would recommend Lifeworks to another family.
